BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS REPORT

On August 10, 2009 the local communities of Silver Creek and Gowanda were devastated by flooding from a terrible storm. Most of the conference center grounds were fine, save a lot of tree limbs and branches from the severe winds. Pilgrim Lodge, however, was flooded. When I entered the building there was between 6-8 inches of water and mud covering entire downstairs. The crawl space under the building (about 4 feet) was completely full of water as well. The drainage pipes had filled with mud. So, we began the clean up. At this point we didn't know if we would be able to salvage the building. The water had caused a lot of damage. Mold had begun to set in, and the floors, sub-flooring, drywall on the walls and insulation under the building and in the walls were all beyond repair. The mold had to be treated and everything else torn out and replaced. This would cost tens of thousands of dollars. Then we got a huge break, when Julie reported this to our insurance company we found out our policy included flood insurance! Then we were able to plan for a new and better Pilgrim Lodge. Contractors have come in and at this point their share of the renovation is almost complete. We have tried to give a warmer, more "lodge" feeling in the decorating. The main room has been carpeted. Two of the storage rooms have been converted to our winter offices. I think that the groups that use the building will be much more comfortable. The new renovations also make the building much more marketable to outside groups that might want to use the building for retreats or conferences. We were able to put in a little of our own money and have the contractors paint and install new carpets in the upstairs as well. They were very much needed. I have a lot more work to do inside. Our insurance didn't cover everything that needed to be fixed or updated. Our plan is to have the building done by the end of January for the first weekend retreat.

FROM THE HISTORIAN'S QUILL

A hush fell over the dining hall as the Rev. Dr. Ralph Anderson picked up the microphone to give the blessing at the annual DCC Dinner, where camp clothes were not to be seen. Dr. Anderson, addressed as Ralph by most, indicated a strange feeling, not wearing shorts, today totally acceptable anywhere in Camp.

As historian I have spent considerable time browsing through old photo albums and Family Camp Log Books from the 1920's, '1930's and 1940's and comparing the manner of dress with that of today. In that era, Ralph would not have worn shorts in the Dining Hall!

During the first ELTS encampment in 1924, a year after the completion of the Dining Hall, the men wore baggy trousers, shirts with detachable collars and sleeves rolled to the elbows on a hot day, and a tie, often, even when breakfasting on the beach. The women wore dresses or skirts of cotton or voile, reaching mid-calf, silk hose and sturdy walking shoes. In those early days, a bathing suit revealing white skins was thought to be quite daring in the 1920's when sun tans were not in vogue and a full length robe or cover up, was a MUST when walking to and from the beach. Upon arrival and departure, the ladies wore hats and gloves.

The manner of dress in those early years is long gone. Is there one today? Yes! Along with shorts, it is blue jeans, Ts and sweat shirts for men, women and children along with babes in arms. But what has not changed is the Dunkirk Spirit. It's called LOVE.

DCC BOARD MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

AUGUST 2009 – Response by the Dunkirk community to use the pool over the summer was huge. The Dunkirk Rotary Club will be holding their end of the year meeting at DCC. Electronic Giving is up and running on the web site and we already have people using it. It was estimated that approx. \$30,000 in damages we sustained by Pilgrim Lodge during the flood. Dining Hall basement flooded as well. New water heater was OK but \$750 in damage to phone system. With the response of people, the staff's frugality and offerings from Family Camp, our projected deficit is down to \$53,000. Gary Burdick will not be directing Family Camp II after this year. He led it for 27 years. Town Hall meetings held at Family Camps. Many complaints of the report that the camp might close. We will have 5-10 theme baskets at the annual dinner as a fund raiser. Centennial Committee raised their goal from 3 to 5 million dollars. Ebenezer Endowment fund gave us \$5,000.

September 2009 – West Seneca Band camp has booked again for next year. Music Festival had between 70-80 attend. Program Committee is having difficulty getting leadership for some of next years events. Renovation of Pilgrim Lodge is coming along nicely. Had to put new drain pipes in under the building. The insurance has been maxed out at \$50,000. Want a better format for our Quick Book receipts being sent to donors. The new one is too business oriented. We are going back to the Early Bird discount next year, but will only have one, not two. Deadline will be April 15th. Our projected deficit is down to about \$19,000. Evaluations for Earl and Julie will be passed out at next board meeting to board members. Contacting Aurora Financial Group to investigate investing with them for our Endowment fund. Ninety seven people signed up for annual dinner. Thirty-seven to take the bus. Carol Bieler made and donated a quilt to be raffled off with proceeds to go to DCC. Made about \$500 at annual dinner on the theme baskets.

October 2009 – October 24 is DCC's Halloween Night. Two small groups will be using DCC within the next week; 39 from Fredonia College and a group from Dunkirk Memorial Hospital. Julie and Kathy Aldrow are working on grant writing in hopes of receiving camp grants. One camp is for having inner city children who otherwise would not experience a camp outside the city setting. Taste of Dunkirk will be held again this year. All items will be \$8. Dates were set for 2010 Walk-a Thon, September 18, and DCC Annual dinner October 2. Dates for the 2010 camping season and events are just about completed and the brochure should be printed and available soon. Except for Junior High Directors, which are not firmed up yet, all other youth and Family camp directors were approved. Treasurer reported that the Walk a Thon raised slightly more than \$27,000, with monies still to come in. With the staff holding the line on spending and peoples generosity the projected deficit for 2009 is a manageable \$16,000. Personnel committee asked board members to return their evaluation sheets so that they can complete the reviews of the Executive Director and The Director of Buildings and Grounds for November.

FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT

The financial picture at Dunkirk has improved. The current figures in our Current Assets as of October 10, 2009 are as follows: Petty Cash - \$,316; Checking Acct \$63,046; Cabin Acct \$6,916; Fund Raising \$27,954; Centennial \$4,105; UCC Funds \$72,197; Total Available Cash \$ 175,534.

At this point we are looking forward to operating next year and for the foreseeable future. The response to our various fund raising activities has been truly a very positive experience and will need to be repeated in the years to come. .Another positive this year has been our ability to drastically reduce expenses thanks to Julie and Earl and many others. The Endowment Fund stands at \$ 267,545.
