Registration for the 2010 camp season has begun. The Early Bird Discount has returned! Make sure your registration form is post-marked to DCC by 4/15/10 to take advantage of this lower rate. BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS REPORT

The renovations of Pilgrim Lodge have kept me very busy this off season. The contractor's work left the building stunning yet unfinished. I decided I wanted to take another step and work on the details that would really make the building a showpiece on the grounds. We wanted the building to be an attractive conference center in the local area, businesses and groups could use for meetings and conferences. These are a few of the upgrades and special touches I worked on.

- New outlets & switches to replace those that were broken and/or covered in paint
- Downstairs, new wooden switch-plate covers, stained to match the new woodwork.
- New decorative light fixtures throughout the upstairs, in the bedrooms and hallways
- Julie made new curtains for the bedrooms
- New sump pump installed in crawlspace under the building and tied into new drainage system
- Bought new cedar log furniture, (Adirondack style) again, stained it to match the new woodwork.
- Bought new, lightweight 8' folding tables
- Rounded up some wooden folding chairs that we already had, stained and varnished them to look like new
- Installed an electric fireplace

While these new purchases sound pretty extravagant and expensive, we shopped around locally and online and got amazingly low prices on almost everything. For example, the fireplace was a close-out at Walmart for \$169.00.

Over the next couple of months I am going to be working on-

- Sanding and refinishing kitchen cupboards
- Sanding and painting all baseboard heating covers
- Replacing entrance doors
- Painting the exterior trim and concrete to create an appealing entrance

As always your support is appreciated and much needed. There are several projects that have to be completed this spring and your donations greatly help in their financing. Pilgrim Lodge and Julie's home both desperately need new roofs. Julie's is leaking into her living room. These will cost about \$30,000. Several cabins, that do not have sponsors, need roofs as well. DCC will have to pay for them at about \$3000.00 each. If you are interest in sponsoring or co-sponsoring a cabin please let me know.

FROM THE HISTORIAN'S QUILL

Jacob's Well, in front of the Dining Hall, is a stone reproduction of the Old Testament Well near Sychar in Palestine. Countless numbers of groups and individuals have congregated there to start a hike, to receive further instructions or to form a prayer circle. Formal group photographs, and more informal photos with young people standing on the top or sitting on the stone sides, legs dangling over the edge, were taken there.

In earlier days there was water in the bottom of the Well "to remind visitors of 'the living water' which Jesus promised to all." And what fun it was to toss in coins and watch them form circles until sinking to the bottom. What became of all those coins?

Since its dedication in 1933 Jacob's Well has become a Dunkirk landmark and in the years to come "meet at the Well" will ring out.

DUNKIRK CENTENNIAL FUND - PHASE I

Do you remember the people and places that had the most profound impact on your faith development? For many of us, it was our church camp experiences at the Dunkirk Conference Center, that little bit of heaven on the shores of Lake Erie.

The Centennial Fund was envisioned as a way to ensure Dunkirk's ministry will continue to touch lives today, tomorrow and into the future. In late November, 2009 friends of Dunkirk were invited to accept the challenge of making a one time gift or three year pledge to the Centennial Fund. The response has been enthusiastic. You have given as you are able, with gifts ranging from \$10 checks to \$20,000 pledges.

The goal for Phase I (through 2012) is \$1,000,000. To accomplish that, we must raise at least \$333,000 in 2010.

In 2009 we collected \$7,426.67 this was through one-time donations and pledges

For 2010 - our pledges, so far, are \$15, 272.34

For 2011- our pledges are \$24,874.67

For 2012- our pledges are \$24,078.00

The accumulative total to date is \$71,651.68 in pledges and donations.

DCC BOARD MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

November 2009 – Halloween event was a success despite the bad weather. Had over 400 children. Julie has been working on grant writing. One hundred quarts of stew were sold for the 1st months Taste of Dunkirk. The 2010 camp brochure looks fantastic! We are doing better financially and have not had to borrow anywhere this year. When we received the detailed invoices for the work at Pilgrim’s, we were extended a 50% discount! In pin pointing repairs Earl reported that both houses on the grounds need foundation work as well as some windows in each be replaced. Work continues in filling all our open camp director positions. Our Accountant still has not filed 2008 taxes and has no excuse for this. Next years date for Walk-4-DCC will be September 18th. Attendance at the walk at the high school level was disappointing. Received the resignation of Judith Dumitru, from the board, due to her new work commitments. Jeff Ribbeck went over the personnel evaluations of Julie and Earl that the board members submitted.

December 2009 – Endowment Funds and United Church Foundation Funds were transferred to the Aurora Financial Group. The advantage is that they advise and manage the fund regularly. We replaced our current accountant and hired Johnson and Mackowiak as our accountant for 2010. Marsha reported that Centennial fund pledges and money received to date is \$53,580.01. Mike Hanes reported that money received from this year’s walk is about \$30,000. Julie was inducted into the Rotary of Dunkirk. Roswell Park is interested in sending kids to camp and Julie will work with them to develop a new program. Julie registered the camp as a Central Contractor with the US Federal Govt. as another avenue to obtain funds. In 2009 we had an increase in campers, and will finish in the black. 2009 catering revenue was \$31,957.88 with an approximate profit of \$18,445. Working on a brochure for Pilgrim Lodge in order to promote its use. Forty-five community families used the pool this summer. The Board passed a 2010 working budget of \$3,750.49 surplus.

FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT

Thanks to all who helped support DCC in 2009. It was through your financial efforts that we were to finish the year with a positive outlook and cash flow. The final figures of year end December 31, 2009 are as follows: Petty Cash - \$2,265; Checking Account \$36,159; Cabin Account \$8,166; Scholarship Account \$5,100; Centennial Fund \$10,094; UCC Funds \$72,638; Total Available Cash \$134,422. The Endowment Fund stands at \$ 415,082. Our net income was \$7,614 **in the black!**

Comparing the year end 2009 to 2008 we are almost \$100,000 ahead in our total assets compared to last year. Our financial picture is definitely looking up.
