MESSAGE FROM OUR DCC PRESIDENT

Spring has arrived in the area and so has the 2010 Camp season at Dunkirk Conference Center. The trees are starting to bud while the flowers are starting to grow up through the dirt to show their colors. Our Maintenance staff has begun to open the buildings by getting the water turned on throughout the grounds, picking up debris left behind by winter and putting on the final touches at Pilgrim Lodge. Only one water leak has been found. They are still trying to locate the source of the problem as we go to print. They also discovered that 4 cabins, Pilgrim Lodge and the Executive Director's home all needed roofs to be replaced immediately. Unfortunately, the timing was not good. The Board of Trustees had to move funds around to secure the immediate payment for the replacement of these roofs during the first half of April. The roof project has been completed at a cost of \$53,000. This project also included the re-pointing of the brick on the Executive Director's home, tearing down the chimney and replacing the dry wall in the living room because of the mold within the same home. It was a job well done by professionals at a very reasonable cost to Dunkirk.

While moving forward with our summer camps this year, the theme is "Be a Hero". We are challenging all to step up and be the hero to another person, child, grand child or friend by simply supporting them to attend camp or even paying all or part of the fee associated with that camp. Our Program Committee has been creative with weekend types of camps that include scrap booking, paint ball, a mini family camp, a golf weekend and others. Some people will have a second opportunity to attend these same camps this fall. Watch the web site and flyers for further details.

The Board of Trustees looks forward to another fun filled season of vibrant and exhilarating camps that will offer many exciting and memorable opportunities for our campers to experience and to learn what being a camper at the Dunkirk Conference Center is all about. BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS REPORT

This year the season is starting out great!!

The winter was not too hard on us. Except for the usual sea of fallen branches, the grounds made it through the snow and wind well. In April, we had to contract out for a great deal of work to be done. Four cabins in the row needed new roofs, a couple quite desperately. The cabins did not all have sponsors so the camp had to bear some of the cost. The roofs were \$3600 each. Pilgrim Lodge also needed a new roof. The existing roof was the original from the 1980's. It was severely damaged in several areas and the plywood under the shingles was quite squishy. With all of the new renovations inside, we wanted to be sure there would be no leaks. Julie's house also needed a roof. The living room in the house had been damage by leaking. This had been a recurring problem for years around the chimney. Upon inspection, the chimney was found to be unsafe. In the end, we had it taken down, covered the area and made it part of the roof. The interior of her house was repaired and two large cracks in the foundation fixed. The total bill for the three projects was \$53,000! Ouch!!

The sewer lines from Darcy's house to the barn had to be dug up and replaced, leaving the parking area at the barn a broken-up mess. Not to mention it was already a broken mess. Many of the piers under the cabins are tipping or have fallen over. So our next big project will be to jack up the cabins and repair them.

In better news, this summer's maintenance staff is just great! Pete Galardo starting working for me in November and just recently has been promoted to Assistant Director of Buildings and Grounds. Pete is a great guy who can do all kinds of work... electrical, plumbing, mechanical, and carpentry. It is great to have an assistant with all these skills. I just hired two seasonal workers, Dave and Don. Don has years of experience in landscaping. We have given him the responsibility of being the groundskeeper this summer. Dave also is very well-rounded in his skills. With these guys working for me we have accomplished a great deal this spring. The grounds already look great as of this writing at the end of April and if all goes well, we should be working on some projects that have been on my to-do list for years. I now have the quality staff to really get things done!! Well... I better get back to work... see you at camp!

The financial status of DCC as of March 31, 2010 is as follows: Current Assets: Petty Cash \$809; Checking Acct \$31,970; Cabins \$7,336; Scholarship \$100; 1st Aurora Financial \$49,185 for Total Assets of \$91,177. Restricted cash Assets: Endowment Fund \$281,833. Total Assets and Net Worth \$373,010.

It should be noted that we are far from "out of the woods". The upkeep on several buildings and other infrastructure is going to continue to be a costly item for the foreseeable future. We need to duplicate last year's financial effort for the next SEVERAL years to climb out of the hole. We need everyone's ideas and efforts to create a lasting legacy for the generations to come.

DCC BOARD MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

February 2010 – Bookings for this season: Episcopal Church is returning and Christ Church of Buffalo is interested in a long weekend. Applied for Ford Friendship Grant to get a new camp vehicle. Completed concept and developed materials for Send a Kid to Camp Program to be presented to businesses. Designed two new presentations- one for Attica and one for Faith Williamsville and presented at both. Pilgrims work: Rearranged bedrooms upstairs, hung new curtains, Assembled and installed new coat-racks in foyer, Sanded and refinished old wooden, folding chairs, Sanded and refinished new Pilgrim Lodge furniture. Clean and organized barn and pole barn. Endowment – reported \$9,780 dividend from 2009 investments. Salem UCC dinner profits for DCC \$1,137. Jeff Wirth has converted 75% of our website to a new venue. We need Helmets for those using the climbing wall. Board approved a Strategic Planning and Development Committee.

March 2010 – Opening prayer dedicated to the memory of Maggie Haas. Julie sent info to area schools and businesses about opportunity to sponsor a child to attend camp for \$200. Area families will submit names for drawing. Sponsor will be invited to camp to have lunch with the winner. Radio commercial for DCC is playing on local stations. Calculated last years volunteer hours at 28,000+. Created Retreat Flyer for distribution to churches. Remodeled kitchen cabinets in Pilgrim's. Installed new sump pumps in Director's house & Pilgrim's. Board carefully discussed necessary roof repairs. Voted for repairs estimated at \$45,000. Money to come from cash reserves, interest from the Endowment Fund, \$2,000 in Cabin Funds, and the rest from recent contributions to the Centennial Fund. Increased reimbursement from 7% to 10% to Directors of each camp for supplies they purchase. Endowment committee looking for another person to replace Joan Litwin who resigned. Salem UCC hosting another Spaghetti dinner to benefit DCC. With Maggie's passing, Hugh Guillaume has stepped forward to become Camp Historian.

April 2010 – Sewer line from the Caretaker's house out past the barn has deteriorated and is being replaced. New roof concern. The Activity Center roof over the garage doors needs replacing. Cost Estimate is \$16,000. Want to solicit volunteers to do the work to save money. 12 area businesses will be sponsoring campers this season! We have begun to use Americore and it has resulted in abundant savings. New front door for Director's house \$35. Priced new at Home Depot \$500-\$600. Mike Hanes has created mini-flyers to promote various camps and they will be distributed. A new and revised Camp Director's manual has been completed. Finance Committee reported that we are still in a precarious financial state. For the 3 cabins needing sponsors: Bieler Family will sponsor Cabin #2, Dan Kowal Construction will sponsor Cabin 3. Still looking for a sponsor for Cabin 10. DCC Auxiliary donated \$1,200 to the camp. Fredonia High School Prom will be held at the Conference Center May 15th.

A few days later, the Quilt World Magazine arrived in the mail box. I was so excited I ran for the house, announcing, "Yes, yes; this is the sign I've been waiting for from God as I showed the book cover to Ronny. I said see, "God does answer prayers". This was perfect – KUMBAYAH, a camp song we have sung so many times. So the next time we went out to Dunkirk, as Ronny mowed the lawn again, I took a ride over to the QUILTED MEMORIES store about a mile into Dunkirk from our camp.

It was there that I purchased my materials and all the beautiful colors that would eventually have meaning about Dunkirk Conference Center. Away I went with my purchased amounts of material and began cutting according to the directions for "Intermediate sewers". It was supposed to be 78" x 90", star block sizes of 9" x 9", and the number of blocks was to be 48. I thought to myself, this wasn't going to be big enough. Most people have a Queen or King size bed. If they have a full size bed, at least if they roll over a lot, they are still covered too. As I wanted it to be larger, I added more rows of stars; one at the top and one at the bottom plus about 3 rows of squares on each side so it could be called Queen/King. It measures 96" x 112".
