On behalf of the Board of Trustees. Thank You, Thank You, Thank you for your strong support in 2025.

Busy summer at camp... The entire summer was busy with youth and family camps. It was great to see the campus, pool, Mothers Memorial and Vesper Point provide such joy to so many. Our Day Camp Program also grew with over 50 children per day, and local swim lessons were maxed out again. All this led to a record for camper revenue which is so important to our continued mission. That said, we still have plenty of room to grow.

We just wrapped up the Halloween Happening. This community event was a resounding success as good weather allowed almost 100 volunteers to entertain an estimated 650 youths and adults. This is surely one of the largest crowds on campus in one day. The kids smiles were our reward.

2025 was a very successful year. Strong camper revenue, along with your generous donations, allowed us to cover operating expenses and provide some much-needed maintenance to our facilities and equipment. The many financial challenges, not unique to DCC, included an increase in the minimum wage, rising food costs and utilities as well as an industry wide surge in insurance costs. A solid bottom line is telling us we have strong support and are well positioned to provide fellowship, learning and fun in a welcoming Christian environment.

We also accomplished several major projects to help improve the camper experience. These were primarily supported by your donations and the funds raised during the 2nd Century Campaign. Projects included...

- Caretaker house...painting and cleaning as well as a new boiler and updated water lines.
- Mothers Memorial...new metal roof and dormer windows
- Pool...new pump house motor and chlorinator. A lift chair was also added
- New Mowers...we also repaired or added needed leaf blowers and trimmers.
- Utilities... included some electrical and water line updating.
- Dining hall...We replaced a vintage dish washing machine in the Dining Hall that failed early in the season.
- Volunteers are working on clearing and marking trails across the street
- New windows were installed in cabins 6 and 17.
- Necessary repairs, painting and cleaning
